Farmers know that to plow a straight furrow, the farmer must keep their sights focused forward. We, too, must look forward as a Catholic church. The farm taught me about hard work and the importance of community. We are called to serve one another and to respond to God's call beyond our neighborhoods – especially to those in most need.


Thank you for your faith and prayers and for your consideration to renew your support this year. May God bless you and your families — and may the seeds you've sown bear a rich harvest of hope.


