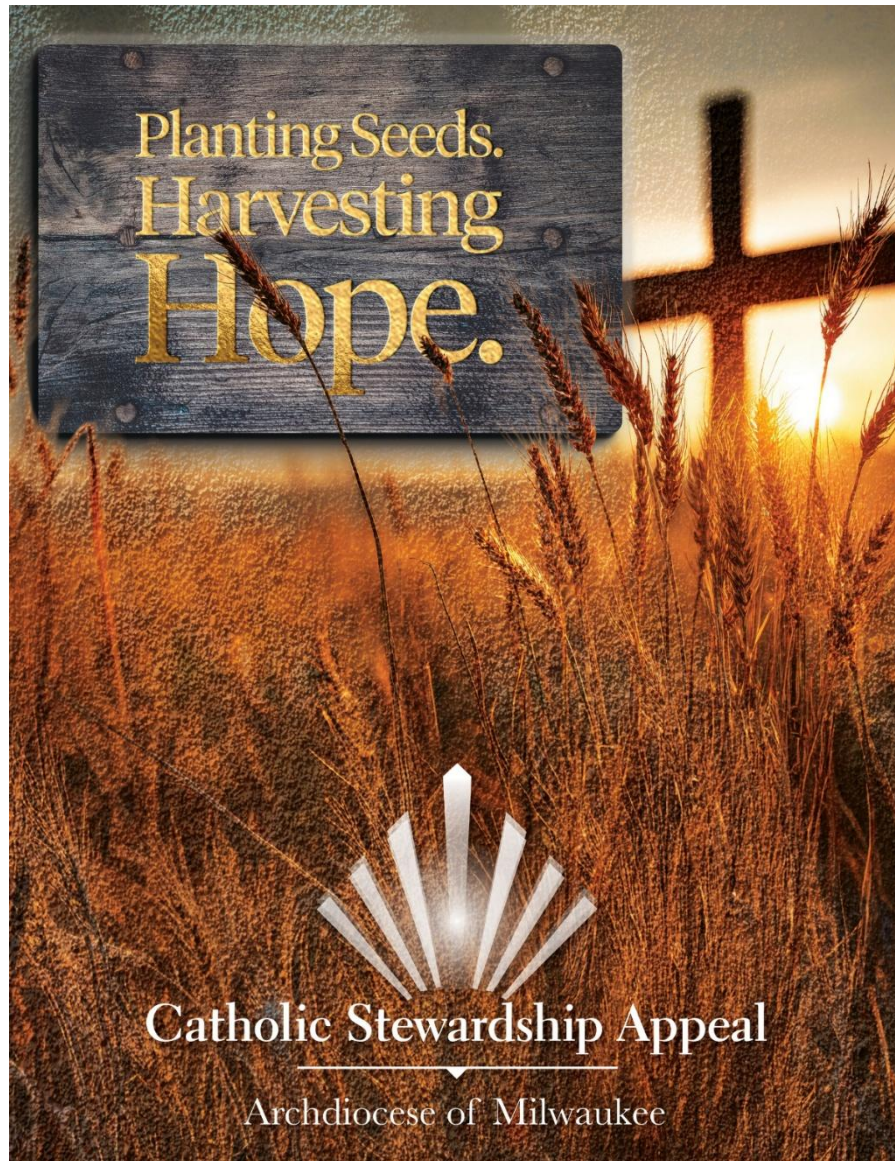

- **Consider promoting recurring giving to your parishioners.** Donors may choose to set up an ongoing recurring gift through the Appeal giving page, in addition to making a one-time gift or annual pledge.
- **CSA resources are available in English and Spanish, both in this guidebook and online.** A link to additional materials is included.
- **In-Pew Program:** We **strongly encourage and are happy to support** each parish in identifying a weekend of masses for an in-pew solicitation for the Catholic Stewardship Appeal. The in-pew solicitation is a highly effective way to engage parishioners, particularly new donors, in the Appeal. We encourage you to select a weekend in the Fall (or whatever time of year works best for your parish) to conduct the In-Pew program. Please reach out to me for guidance, materials, and support.

Catholic Stewardship Appeal-Funded Ministries

Contributions to the Catholic Stewardship Appeal are restricted to support ministries and services across the Archdiocese of Milwaukee and are organized into four key ministry areas. Together, these areas reflect the shared mission of the Church—to serve those in need, form faithful leaders, strengthen parish life, and nurture faith across generations.

Forming Priests, Deacons, and Lay Leaders

The Catholic Stewardship Appeal provides significant support for the formation of priests, deacons, and lay leaders who serve our parishes. This includes education and formation through St. Francis de Sales Seminary, the Office for Diaconate Formation and ongoing leadership development—helping ensure every parish is supported by well-prepared and faithful leaders.

Strengthening Parish Ministries and Promoting Evangelization

This ministry area supports parish renewal and evangelization efforts that help people encounter Christ and grow in faith. Through resources, training, and support for parish ministries—including marriage and family life, campus and young adult ministry, and worship and music—these efforts enrich parish life and strengthen communities of faith.

Serving Those in Need

Through Catholic Charities and other outreach and pastoral ministries, the Catholic Stewardship Appeal supports individuals and families facing challenging circumstances throughout southeastern Wisconsin. These ministries provide counseling and mental health services, prison and jail ministry, deaf and intercultural outreach and other compassionate responses that uphold human dignity and reflect the Church's care for those most in need.

Supporting Catholic Schools and Parish Religious Education

The Appeal helps ensure that children, youth and adults throughout the Archdiocese receive strong and joyful faith formation. By supporting leadership, services, and resources for Catholic schools and parish religious education programs, these efforts help form disciples and strengthen families and communities.

Keys to a Successful Appeal

Share the Video We encourage you to share the Catholic Stewardship Appeal 2026 video with your parishioners as part of your parish's Appeal efforts. Available in English and Spanish, the video provides a shared message across the Archdiocese, helping parishioners understand the mission of the Appeal, this year's theme *Planting Seeds. Harvesting Hope.* and how their gifts make a difference.

In addition to showing the video during Kickoff Weekend, parishes are encouraged to use the video throughout the year by:

- posting it on the parish website
- including it in parish emails or newsletters
- sharing it on parish social media channels
- showing it at parish meetings, stewardship gatherings or formation events

For parishes that do not have the capacity to play a video during Mass, an audio message in English and Spanish is also available. Step-by-step instructions for downloading and sharing the video and audio message are provided in a separate resource. If you need assistance, please contact the Development Office.

Mobile Giving Mobile giving offers a simple way for parishioners to begin their gift in the moment. By texting **APPEAL2026** to **414-348-8380**, parishioners receive a secure link to the CSA online giving page. This option is especially effective to promote at Mass, in bulletins and in other parish communications.

In-Pew Program We encourage each parish to schedule an in-pew weekend as part of the Appeal. This opportunity allows parishioners to make a gift easily and thoughtfully, particularly those who may have intended to give but have not yet done so. In-pew solicitations are one of the most effective ways to engage parishioners, especially new donors. We encourage you to select a weekend in the Fall (or another time that works best for your parish). Materials and support will be provided in advance.

Participation Matters Every gift, whether \$1 or \$1,000, plays an important role in sustaining ministry. While financial support is essential, encouraging broad participation helps foster a culture of stewardship and shared responsibility within the parish.

Show Parish Impact The Appeal funds ministries and services that many parishes and schools cannot provide on their own. These include faith formation in schools and parishes, training and support for parish ministries and the formation of seminarians and deacon candidates who will serve our parishes. Let parishioners know these services are provided at no cost to parishes and are a direct benefit of their shared generosity.

Lead by Example As a pastor or parish lay leader, you set the tone and expectation for participation and giving. Your personal example of stewardship and financial support to the Appeal speaks volumes. Sharing your reasons for giving helps parishioners reflect on their own call to stewardship and see generosity not as an obligation, but as a joyful response to God's generosity.

Online Giving The Catholic Stewardship Appeal online giving page allows parishioners to make a one-time gift, annual pledge or ongoing recurring contribution. Giving options include credit card, electronic funds transfer (EFT) and mobile wallet options such as Apple Pay, Google Pay, and Paze. Encourage parishioners to visit www.catholicappeal.org to give online.

Homily Reflections & Talking Points for the Catholic Stewardship Appeal

Planting Seeds. Harvesting Hope.

CSA 2026 Kickoff Weekend: February 7–8

*This year, Archbishop Jeffrey Grob is excited to share a new Catholic Stewardship Appeal theme: **Planting Seeds. Harvesting Hope.** Inspired by lessons from his boyhood growing up on a farm in Cross Plains, Wisconsin, this theme invites us to reflect on how faith, generosity and trust in God bear fruit over time.*

In the February CSA mailing to parishioners, he will highlight that “Farmers know that to plow a straight furrow, they must keep their sights focused forward. We, too, must look forward as a Catholic Church. Above all, living on a farm taught me that we reap what we sow. As St. Paul says in his letter to the Corinthians, ‘I planted, Apollos watered, but God gave the growth.’”

Living out our mission

The Catholic Stewardship Appeal is one of the most tangible ways we live out our shared mission across the Archdiocese of Milwaukee. Each gift, no matter the size, makes a meaningful difference in the lives of many. Through the Appeal, our ministries continue to flourish. This year’s video spotlights:

- Our growing St. Francis de Sales Seminary, where gifts directly support the spiritual and educational formation of 40 future priests called to serve parishes in southeastern Wisconsin
- Catholic values taking root in young people in more than 100 Catholic schools
- Our central city parishes, serving parish families who speak more than 20 different languages

Points to consider to introduce the new theme

Archbishop Grob emphasizes that we are called to serve one another and to respond to God’s call beyond our neighborhoods, especially to those in most need.

- **Gospel connection**

The Gospel passage for February 7 and 8 is from the Gospel of Matthew 5:13-16.

“Your light must shine before others that they may see your good deeds and glorify your heavenly Father.”

As we launch our 2026 Catholic Stewardship Appeal, we have a meaningful opportunity to reflect on the many blessings, and the light, God has bestowed upon us. I invite each parishioner to prayerfully discern how he or she is being called to share and shine God's light through their own generosity. This moment invites us to **reflect on where God is calling us to plant seeds of hope** through our time, talent and treasure. We are also reminded to give thanks for the many harvests God has already brought forth in our lives.

- **Additional key messages and scripture verses driving Archbishop Grob's vision for this exciting moment in the Catholic Church**

As we bridge further into the new liturgical year, it is an especially fitting time to reflect on the renewed momentum within the Catholic Church under the leadership of Pope Leo and Archbishop Grob. You may wish to describe how this leadership creates a ripple effect throughout our region of faith, unity and service.

Top three scripture passages from Archbishop Grob that connect to ***Planting Seeds. Harvesting Hope.***

1. *Gospel of John 15:5*

"I am the vine. You are the branches. Whoever remains in me and I in him will bear much fruit, because without me you can do nothing."

2. *1 Corinthians 3:6*

We reap what we sow. As St. Paul says in his letter to the Corinthians, "I planted, Apollos watered, but God gave the growth."

3. *Gospel of Matthew 13:5–8*

"Some seed fell on rocky ground ... and it withered for lack of roots. Some seed fell among thorns, and the thorns grew up and choked it. But some seed fell on rich soil, and produced fruit, a hundred or sixty or thirtyfold."

Society of 1875

Formerly the Campanile Society



The Society of 1875 is the Catholic Stewardship Appeal's leadership giving community, welcoming all donors who make an annual gift of \$1,000 or more to the Appeal.

Named for the year 1875, when Pope Pius IX elevated the Diocese of Milwaukee to an Archdiocese, the Society of 1875 honors our shared history while supporting the Church's mission today and into the future.

Members of the Society of 1875 take a leadership role in advancing the mission of the Archdiocese of Milwaukee by supporting the ministries funded through the Catholic Stewardship Appeal—ministries that serve those in need, form faithful leaders, strengthen parish life and nurture faith across generations.

Recognition and Engagement

In appreciation of their generosity, members of the Society of 1875 are invited to special opportunities for prayer, recognition and engagement, including an annual recognition Mass and dinner hosted by Archbishop Grob.

Leadership donors also receive ongoing communication and opportunities to stay connected to the impact of the Catholic Stewardship Appeal.

Giving Levels within the Society of 1875

The Society of 1875 includes several recognition levels that reflect a donor's level of leadership giving. Membership is automatic based on a donor's total annual gift to the Catholic Stewardship Appeal.

- **Society of 1875** – \$1,000+
- **Halo of Our Lady** – \$2,500+
- **Bishop's Circle** – \$5,000+
- **Archbishop's Circle** – \$10,000+
- **Beacon of Light Benefactors** – \$25,000+

Each level recognizes a deepening commitment to the mission of the Church and the ministries supported by the Catholic Stewardship Appeal.

A Note for Parish Leaders

Parish leaders are encouraged to speak about leadership giving as an invitation to deeper stewardship rather than a separate appeal. Gifts at every level are important and leadership gifts play a vital role in sustaining the ministries that serve parishes and people throughout the Archdiocese.

Recurring Giving

Why Recurring Giving?

Recurring giving offers parishioners a simple and sustainable way to support the Catholic Stewardship Appeal throughout the year and beyond. By setting up an ongoing recurring gift—monthly, quarterly, or annually—donors can make a meaningful commitment that continues automatically until they choose to make a change. This approach allows parishioners to spread their generosity over time while providing steady, dependable support for ministries that serve people in need, strengthen parishes, and nurture faith across the Archdiocese.

Benefits of Recurring Giving

Recurring giving helps parishioners integrate stewardship into their everyday lives. Many donors appreciate the convenience of automatic payments and the flexibility to adjust or stop their gift at any time. Recurring gifts also help sustain ministries year-round, allowing the Church to respond consistently to ongoing needs. Parishes are encouraged to invite parishioners—especially those who give annually—to consider converting their support into a recurring gift as a meaningful expression of long-term stewardship.

PARISH ROLES & OPERATIONS

*Guidance for parish leaders, staff, and volunteers responsible
for implementing the Appeal*

Parish Appeal Goals

Catholic Stewardship Appeal parish goals are determined using the same method that has been in place for the past several years. This method will again be used to set 2026 parish goals:

- **Financial goal:** 8% of the five-year average of your parish's envelope and offertory
- **Participation goal:** 2% higher than the participation percentage achieved by your parish in the prior year's Appeal

Parish goal letters will be mailed in February 2026. Goals are not mandatory; however, we encourage parishes to regularly promote the Appeal and provide multiple opportunities for parishioners to participate.

Monthly Appeal Reports

Parishes will receive monthly status reports of their progress in the Catholic Stewardship Appeal throughout the year. These reports are shared with pastors, administrators, parish directors and CSA parish advocates to help support ongoing parish planning and communication. Our goal is to make these reports as accessible and timely as possible. In addition to mailed reports, we are working toward distributing reports via email.

The intent of this reporting is to keep the Appeal visible and to support regular communication within the parish. Parishes are encouraged to share appropriate updates in bulletins and other parish communications, helping parishioners stay informed about progress throughout the year.

Parish Responsibilities for the Catholic Stewardship Appeal

Leadership

- Assign a CSA Parish Advocate
- Pastor/Parish Director promotes the CSA at launch weekend, including sharing the CSA video or audio
- Pastor/Parish Director shares message about the CSA at other times throughout the year
- Conduct in-pew solicitation in Fall 2026

Administrative

- Show CSA video or play audio during one weekend of Masses in February 2026
- Use CSA bulletin covers provided by the Archdiocese
- Hang CSA posters in locations visible to parishioners
- Beginning with Kickoff Weekend and extending throughout the year, schedule CSA bulletin announcements, pulpit announcements and intercessions
- Help implement the in-pew program in Fall 2026
- Follow instructions for the processing of gifts that come to your parish office directly

Role of CSA Parish Advocate

As a volunteer CSA Parish Advocate, you are a liaison between the Archdiocese and your parish:

- serving as a spokesperson for the Appeal in your parish
- ensuring the implementation of recommended promotional strategies and activities

Responsibilities

- Coordinate promotion of the CSA during Masses throughout the year
- Personally (or recruit someone to) offer a lay witness talk about impact of the CSA
- Identify opportunities to reach out to parishioners personally about the CSA such as availability after Mass, a reception to promote CSA, outreach via phone calls and emails, etc. Choose what works best for your parish
- Help implement the in-pew program in Fall 2026
- Send thank you notes to CSA donors from your parish
- Maintain regular communications with the pastor, parish director or administrator about the parish's progress toward its Appeal goal

Role of Parish Secretaries and Business Managers

Overview

Oftentimes, parish secretaries and business managers are the ones who receive calls and questions about the Catholic Stewardship Appeal. They are important partners in our efforts to communicate the Appeal's message to parishioners. Parish secretaries, business managers, pastors/parish directors/administrators and CSA Parish Advocates should work together to ensure that everyone has the necessary information about the Appeal.

Responsibilities

Accurate parish records help ensure our communications are respectful and appropriate. To keep our mailing list current, we ask parishes to share updates with the Development Office as they become available.

Send Appeal checks received by your parish to the Archdiocese promptly. Timely processing helps ensure that gifts are acknowledged appropriately and reassures parishioners that their contributions have been received and recorded.

Please do not mail cash to the Archdiocese. If cash gifts are received at the parish, we ask that the parish issue a check for the total amount. When possible, please include the donor's name and gift amount so the gift can be properly credited and acknowledged.
